Bead, Button & Salt Shaker Necklace ~ 10 am - 1 pm

Reuse and recycle in a very fashionable way! We'll create a fun signature necklace using wire, chain, buttons and, best of all, a vintage salt shaker I found at the Elephant's Trunk Flea Market in New Milford, CT We'll incorporate a few of your favorite 6mm-8mm beads to make this a one-of-a-kind necklace.

If you already have jewelry pliers and wire cutters, bring them along, as well as your cup of coffee. I will supply everything else including wire, chain, buttons, salt shaker and jewelry findings. Class fee is \$36.

Skeleton Key Necklace ~ 10am – 1pm

Embellish an actual vintage skeleton key for your focal pendant and create an intriguing necklace with lengths of rosary chain you fashion with your favorite beads. This piece can be romantic, Gothic or steampunk! Bring seed beads and 6mm-8mm beads and jewelry pliers and wire cutters if you have them. I'll provide the skeleton key, chain, wire and jewelry findings. Class fee is \$36.

Sunday, April 23, 2017

Torn-paper Watercolor Technique ~ 1am - 4 pm

Here is a great technique - easy to do, and so variable! When the torn sections are rolled smooth, the look is really wonderful. This process creates a sheet of clay that can be used in a wide variety of ways. Though the examples are of jewelry, the sheets made through this process can be used to cover items including boxes, wine glass bottoms, handles of tools and much more.

Sunday, May 7, 2017

Polymer Feather Canes ~ 1am - 4 pm

In this project, you will create an unusual and lovely feather cane. The whole cane will be in the oblong shape of a feather you'll be able to use slices to create 3-D effects. This is a fun project, and you'll want several in different colors to expand your options.





Sunday, June 4, 2017

Black-Line Transfers – on translucent clay with metal leaf ~ 1am - 4 pmBlack line transfers add drama, interest and design to your creations. They are not difficult to do, they just take some time and a little practice. For this class, we will use black line transfers as the "main attraction" on a brass channel cuff bracelet, or you may make flat pieces in your own desired shape.

Please note: The instructor will supply the following: composite metal leaf, printed black-line designs from which participants can choose, Preserve Your Memories II fixative. The instructor will also have brass channel cuff bracelets and bangles for sale for use in this project, if desired.

Saturday, May 20, 2017

Skinner Blends Running Around in Circles! ~ 9 am - 2 pm

Skinner blends are fun to make and the colors you can make are lovely. Using simple shape cutters, such as circles, squares or triangles, you will create a decorative polymer sheet that can be used to create jewelry, cover objects, etc. Materials: Clay in your choice of colors, pasta machine, glossy work surface, sharp tissue blades, shape cutters, jewelry findings if appropriate, and other clay tools of your choice. Instructor will have clay available for sale if desired.



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Saturday, July 15, 2017

Reversible Tile Bracelet! ~ 9 am - 2 pm

Make 2 pieces at one time! In this project, we will learn to make surface sheets with 2 different designs that, through a series of steps, will turn into tiles with reversible sides. The tiles will then be assembled into a bracelet you can wear right away! Materials: Clay in colors that are complimentary or will work well in a Skinner blend, pasta machine, glossy work surface, sharp tissue blades, needle tool, ruler, rubber stamps, permanent ink pad (black), 1mm elastic bead cord, size 8 seed beads. Instructor will have elastic cord, seed beads and ink pad to share, or you may bring your own.



Saturday, August 12, 2017

Adjustable Tube Bead Lariat! ~ 9 am - 2 pm

This workshop will give you the opportunity to try several different techniques and put them all together in a lovely, wearable piece of art. We will start with a fun square cane, use it to cover a tube bead, create end caps and end beads, and learn how to "thread" the tube bead with buna cord to allow the straps to be adjustable. Materials: Clay in 2-3 colors of your choice as well as white and black, pasta machine, glossy work surface, sharp tissue blades, and small circle shape cutters. Instructor will have buna cord and dowels for tube formation to share, or you may bring your

Saturday June 24, 2017

Polymer Clay Jewelry, 9am – 12pm

This is your chance to learn some jewelry techniques and make a necklace that is completely you - from start to finish. You will make 2-3 beads in your choice of color, shape, size and texture out of polymer clay.

While the beads are curing, you will learn how to make a wire wrapped dangle using mother of pearl dagger beads and how to make a tassel out of fibers or ribbon. You will also have the option of making a wire bail to hang your pendant from a simple cord or leather necklace, or using sari silk for a longer, more ornate design.
